We shall meet Lesley Greene and Steve Trinder, Scheme Directors, who will be able to answer any questions we have about setting up our own scheme. Please dress warmly if the weather is cold as I believe that the site is quite exposed.

On another note, I have had several crop thefts reported. I have mentioned them to the local PCSO but it is really important that allotment holders also report them to the Police on 101. As I call this number most weeks, I can report that it is a really quick and simple process which enables other reported thefts in the area to be linked together, which means better intelligence and it will raise awareness of issues.

I have arranged for some free manure to be delivered to the central parking area. Please help yourselves. I also save the plastic vegetable crates from the market and leave them on the swap table. Hopefully they will be useful for drying vegetables and save the crates from going to landfill.
